



HELP STOP THE SPREAD OF INVASIVE FOREST PESTS

Our forests are threatened by non-native insects and diseases that can kill large numbers of trees. Several recently introduced insects — Asian longhorned beetle, emerald ash borer, goldspotted oak borer, and sirex woodwasp — are wood-infesting species that people can transport long distances in firewood. Once they arrive in new areas, these invaders severely damage our forests and trees.

How you can help:

- Leave your firewood at home
- Collect or buy firewood from local sources where you plan to use it
- When you leave DO NOT take any unused firewood with you
- Follow State firewood regulations
