## Take the poll on Lymantria dispar's name by December 8th!

The renaming process for the moth *Lymantria dispar*, formerly gypsy moth, has seven final candidate names up for review in a public poll. If you choose to participate in the poll you will be 1) asked if your poll response is as an individual or on the behalf of an organization, 2) asked to very briefly describe your interest or work with L. dispar, 3) provided with explanations of the names and then asked to rank them 1-7, and 4) given an opportunity for open comment at the very end. The Entomological Society of America will not be sharing the poll on social media accounts, in an effort to reduce the number of bad-faith (rude or disruptive) poll takers. However, everyone and anyone who will act with good intentions to pick a new name is welcome to take the poll. Complete it by December 8th to have your voice heard.

#### Forest Health Partnership Webinars start December 7th

The Continental Dialogue on Non-native Forest Insects and Diseases is a longstanding group dedicated to bringing diverse stakeholders together to address forest health needs across North America. In lieu of an in-person meeting this year, the Dialogue will be co-hosting a short series of informal webinars themed on existing partnerships and multi-entity projects that are important to the advancement of the forest pest community.

Firewood made from infected 'ōhi'a wood can spread this fungus- as can soil, certain beetles, and new science is also pointing to invasive mammals as a potential vector. # Infestations and Regulations

#### **Good Riddance Snails!**

Congratulations are in order for Florida in the recent announcement of the eradication of Giant African Snail! A substantial infestation of these snails in the Broward and Miami-Dade area was discovered in 2011 and the last live snail was eliminated over three years ago. These snails might grow up to be giantbut egg masses and newly hatched young snails are small and could be transported on infested firewood, so they have been a species of concern in the firewood outreach world for the last 10 years. Kudos to the state, federal, and local partners for uniting against this invasive pest!
