# Infestations and Regulations

## Spotted Lanternfly Now in Michigan

Michigan Department of Agriculture and Rural Development (MDARD) as well as the USDA have confirmed the detection of a small population of spotted lanternfly in Oakland County, Michigan this August. This makes Michigan the 13th state to have an established infestation after the pest was first detected in Pennsylvania in 2014. Many states are increasing their outreach efforts in an attempt to catch new infestations early. While authorities in Michigan suspect the pest may have been brought in via the nursing industry, the state is in the process of developing an exterior quarantine on firewood which will help curtail the introduction of non-native tree pests.
