Capitalize on Autumn Outreach Topics

With hot buggy nights fading away in many areas, we can almost smell the crisp leafy air of fall – and campfires! Firewood Month is a big focus of ours but the outreach for this time of year extends beyond just October. Depending on your region and local recreation opportunities, you may be interested in focusing on specific pests, activities, or demographics. No matter what you decide to focus on, encourage your audience to participate in firewood best practices with positive, action-oriented messaging. For example: Trying to raise awareness on the spotted lanternfly? Include information on how to destroy the eggs- give people information they can use! And don't forget to reach out to hobbyists like hunters, birders, and leaf-peepers, they can be both a great resource for early detection and adopt good firewood practices, all at once.

2022 Continental Forest Dialogue Updates

This year the Continental Dialogue on Non-native Forest Insects and Diseases has two parts- a one day in-person workshop held next week on the theme of international prevention and research, and a series of webinars held in November and December that will cover topics like early detection, rapid response, management, pathways mitigation (like firewood!), and forest resilience within North America.

Infestations and Regulations

Nevada to Adopt New Firewood Regulation

Next week, Nevada will be adopting a new regulation (Nevada Register Document R130-20RP1 - falls under Nevada Administrative Code 554) effecting firewood. It will require labeling and will restrict firewood from being sourced or transported from or through a federal or state quarantined area unless it is treated per the requirements of the regulation.
