Cost-Effective Targeting of High-Risk Montana Visitors

This fall, 19,454 Don't Move Firewood postcards were sent to high risk, out-of-state visitors to Montana – namely, non-resident hunting licensees. Since 2009, the partnership among Don't Move Firewood, Montana DNRC Forestry Division, and Montana Fish Wildlife and Parks has educated more than 500,000 people. In 2013, postcards were sent to almost all of the lower 48 states, while in other years, postcards have only gone to residents of federally quarantined zip codes. Read more about this partnership.
