Comment Period Open on IPPC Int'l Movement of Wood Standards

Importing and exporting wood – including firewood - around the globe presents real risks for moving plant pests. Right now, the International Plant Protection Convention (IPPC) is seeking comment via USDA APHIS on their revised International Movement of Wood Standards, which seeks to improve the reduction of risk of pest movement via the creation of best practices and international cooperation. Comments are due by August 26th 2016.
