## Get ready for millions of Great American Eclipse travelers

A total eclipse of the sun will be visible across the USA on Monday August 21st. There is absolutely no doubt that this will enormously increase interstate travel for the weekend of August 19-20, 2017. Depending on whose estimates you are looking at, the numbers range from a few million to tens of millions of additional travelers nationwide. The Don't Move Firewood campaign will be advertising heavily on Google Adwords in July and August to educate eclipse travelers on safer firewood choices. Regardless of your location, please consider if your agency or organization can do a firewood education press release on August 14th- that is the most likely day that people will be using their smartphone or computer to finish up their preparations for the following travel weekend. #### Farm Bill 10007 Open Period is NOW

The FY2018 open period for submitting suggestions to implement USDA APHIS cooperative agreements through the Farm Bill Plant Pest and Disease Management and Disaster Prevention Program will be from July 10, 2017 through August 18, 2017. This is the program that funds dozens of critically important state agency and university led firewood outreach efforts around the nation. It is also the primary funding mechanism for the Don't Move Firewood campaign. Fun fact: most people say 10007 as "ten double oh seven" like "Bond, James Bond" because that's more fun.

## Is Offering Free Firewood a Viable Solution?

By providing free campfire wood at each reservable campground managed by Jefferson County in Colorado, land managers are doing their best to ensure firewood is sourced locally and not brought from unknown locations or collected illegally from the surrounding park areas. The wood supply comes directly from one of the 29 parks which are strategically monitored and managed by Jefferson County Open Space Forestry Professionals who thin stands, perform fire mitigation and harvest infested trees when appropriate. Look for round exit holes, shallow scars in the bark, sawdust-like material on or around tree, and the beetle itself. # Public Comment open NOW for Utah Firewood Regulation

The Utah Department of Agriculture has released a notice of proposed rule for the newly written Utah Firewood Quarantine. In extremely brief summation; the proposed quarantine allows the state of Utah to regulate the entry of firewood into Utah, and also creates point of origin labeling rules. The public comment period is open NOW through the 17th of July – so read the whole thing right away and comment constructively on this rule! The firewood section is on page 12 of the Utah State Bulletin PDF, which is page 8 as printed.
