## Infestations and Regulations

#### Emerald ash borer spreading in Quebec

*From the news release* Emerald ash borer has been found in the Regional County Municipality of Avignon, in the Gaspésie area of Quebec, in July 2022. As a result, the Canadian Food Inspection Agency (CFIA) will continue to regulate the area with notices of prohibition of movement including regulated articles such ash material and all species of firewood. ... The CFIA plans to consult with federal, provincial, municipal and First Nations partners and other organizations in the near future on options to manage emerald ash borer in eastern Canada.
