Spotted Lanternfly Infestation Confirmed in Illinois for First Time

The spotted lanternfly (SLF) continues its spread outward from the midatlantic states. Its latest find? In Illinois. The Illinois Department of Agriculture has confirmed the first detection of notorious hitchhiker following a report of a live adult on Sept. 16 2023. Since then, a breeding population of SLF has been detected.
