

HELP STOP THE SPREAD OF INVASIVE PESTS & DISEASES.

Our forests are threatened by invasive tree-killing insects and diseases that can hitchhike on firewood. Pests like the emerald ash borer, gypsy moth, and Asian longhorned beetle don't move far on their own – but in a bundle of contaminated firewood taken on a camping trip, they can travel hundreds of miles in a single day. Once transported to uninfested areas, these insects and diseases can emerge and start a new damaging outbreak.

HOW YOU CAN HELP:

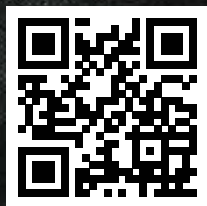
- Leave firewood at home – buy local firewood at or near your destination, or collect firewood on site when permitted.
- Buy or collect only what you'll need, and burn it all completely by the end of your stay.
- If you have already moved firewood, use it immediately. Do not take it home with you, and do not leave any excess firewood on site.
