Protect your favorite places from this threat:

- · Buy locally harvested firewood.
- · Tell your friends not to move firewood.
- Ask a park ranger or campground host about where to get local firewood when you travel.
- Use firewood from nearby sources to heat your home or cabin.

Buy it where you burn it.

Prevention is the key. Don't move firewood when you travel, camp, or visit another state.
