## You never know what is hiding in your firewood...

Invasive insects and diseases are a major threath to Delaware's forests and communities. These tree-killing species can jump hundreds of miles when people move infested forewood.

To protect Delaware's urban, suburban, and forested areas from insects like the emerald ash borer and Asian longhorned beetle, remember:

- Do not bring untreated firewood into Delaware.
- If you have already brought firewood from another area, BURN IT.
   Do not leave it. Do not take it with you.
- Encourage your friends and neighbors not to move firewood.

Also, be advised that it is against state and federal laws to move firewood from areas quarantined for an invasive forest pest. Firewood from Pennsylvania and the western shore of Maryland is currently under quarantine to prevent the spread of Emerald Ash Borer.
